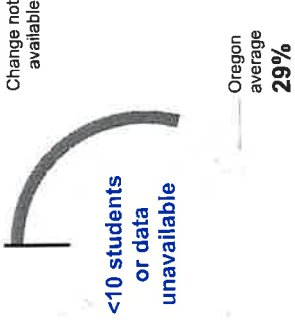

#### About Our School

#### BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

South Columbia Family School has always taken great steps to provide a safe environment for all students. Our school is equipped with cameras and windows where individuals cannot see into the classroom. Along with a perimeter fence, we feel safe here. The school takes any question of bullying and/or harassment seriously. SCFS's Board had an anti-bullying policy, and it is strongly enforced. Staff go through yearly training on how to deal with these issues if they arise.

#### EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

SCFS provides various extracurricular events for students. Normally, we begin the year with a social activity involving the families, either at a park or at the school. We offer both after school activities and enrichment events for both our students and the families. As an example, our after school program has clubs such as chess, Dungeons and Dragons, pickleball, art, and other activities. Our enrichment activities may include hikes, visits to places such as Oregon Children's Theater or the Oregon Zoo, and hikes in the local areas. We usually have a good participation in these events.

#### PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Since SCFS is known as the "family" school, we engage parents from the very start. Parents are expected to work diligently with their child on their educational goals and expectations. Parents meet with teachers on a weekly basis to ensure that all parties are engaged in the child's learning process. When we have family activities, we encourage all parents to attend, and, frequently, they can bring their younger children. The staff of SCFS and the families get to know each other in a positive manner.

#### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

SCFS is located in Warren, Oregon, which is a small, rural community in Columbia County. Since our students may come from other communities within the county, we have to consider our community as county-wide. We have board members who do not live in Warren, but do reside in the county. We have good working relationships with the local libraries, the swimming pool and bowling alley, and the local parks and recreation. We use the contacts with our sponsoring district to engage other community members, such as tribal associations.
