The initial meeting of SCFS's Parent-Teacher Organization was held on Thursday, March 16, to establish guidelines about positions, voting, finances, and parent involvement.

The meeting was led by Shawnathan Thibodeaux, our middle school teacher, who will assume the position of pro tem president until an

election can be held. Any parent or staff member may be a member, except for the administrator, Mr. Brown, who will only serve as a legal and practical advisor.
