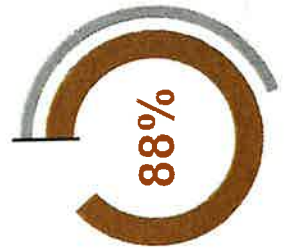

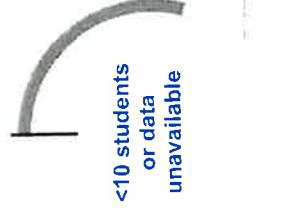
MATHEMATICS

About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

SCFS engages with Safe Oregon for safety reasons for our students. Our anti-bullying policy is reinforced by our social and emotional policy so every student will feel safe and welcome at our school. We continue to use remote cameras and locked doors for safety and security. Due to the nature of our school, few instances of bullying or harassment occur, but if so, they are dealt with in a quick and efficient manner, based on the board policies.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Parents meet with the teachers on a weekly or bi-weekly basis. We engage parents through enrichment activities where they are able to participate as a family in a school activity. Monthly newsletters are sent to the parents to keep them informed of school events.
